PROGRAM UPDATES:

Tiffany Shirley once again reported on the Coalition's recent media campaign for the recently received Opioid grant, emphasizing positive "Healthy ways to de-stress." She stated that campaigns are running all around Eddy County (Artesia, Seven Rivers, Loving, Carlsbad, etc.) by way of standard billboards, electronic billboards, newspaper ads, movie theatre ads, radio ads, and more.

Julie Fuentes reported that the All Stars program haws began for 8th graders at Alta Vista and PR Leyva campuses. She stated that there are several Spanish speaking students this year. Julie reported on the Sources of Strength program has also gotten underway at the ECHS, AV, PR Leyva, and CHS campuses. Julie also updated the group on the TOP Club in Loving is back together and trying to decide what their community service learning projects will be this year. Some of the ideas already talked about include collecting dog toys for animal shelters, sending thank you cards to athletes, and Red Ribbon Week activities. 22 students are enrolled in the program this year, which Julie stated is a very large class.

Hannah Ornelas gave an update for Teens in Action. She stated that 33 nominations came in for the program at the AV Campus and they are now meeting in the library program room. She covered the "Pies for Prevention" campaign coming up in which the community has been asked to "vote" to have someone get pied in the face for a fundraiser. The person with the most votes will get pie in the face at the Saturday, October 5th Farmers/Makers' Market Downtown. Hannah reported the TIA program was awarded the SIMCO grant they applied for which will put funds towards healthy youth activities around town hosted by the group. Hannah reported that they had 71 students come to Top Nock for their last TIA event. The next event coming up will be the Tailgate Party on Friday, October 11, 2024 before the CHS football game.
